

North Denes Repairs

Lowestoft, Suffolk

What are we updating you about?

Coastal Partnership East are the coastal management team for East Suffolk, North Norfolk District, and Great Yarmouth Borough Councils and are responsible for coastal management. We have appointed Roadtechs to complete repairs to the promenade at North Denes, Lowestoft.

Where is this work happening?

A map of where the work is taking place is on the back of this factsheet. The work is spread along the promenade approximately between the Birds Eye factory and Links Road, Lowestoft. The contractor will access the promenade at Links Road and transport heavy plant and machinery to their working location at the beginning and end of each day.

When are we doing the work?

Work will take place from 11th June 2024 and last approximately four weeks, allowing our contractor to maximise work around daily tides. All work is subject to safe working conditions i.e. tide and weather condition dependent.

What will we be doing?

The repairs will include removing and replacing damaged joint sealant by drilling a wider joint in the existing concrete and filling with TechCrete. Some cracks in the existing concrete slabs will also be filled. There will be heavy plant and machinery on site. The work will involve closures of the promenade in approximately 200m sections as work progresses and diversions will be clearly signposted. Diversion routes may not be fully accessible.

We will work hard to keep any inconvenience to a minimum and ask the public to please take note of the contractor's signage when work is happening.

Why are we doing this work?

This work will improve flood defence assets and is an important part of East Suffolk Council's commitment to ensure that the coastal assets they are responsible for are working effectively and are safe for the public, helping to protect our beautiful and important coastline economically and environmentally and for the enjoyment of communities and visitors for generations to come.

Undertaking regular targeted maintenance means that we can maximise the lifespan of coastal protection assets, ensuring that we make the most of every pound spent and achieve a better return on public investment. We are supporting the safeguarding of life and local economies by making sure that the Council's coastal assets are in the condition needed for continued protection.

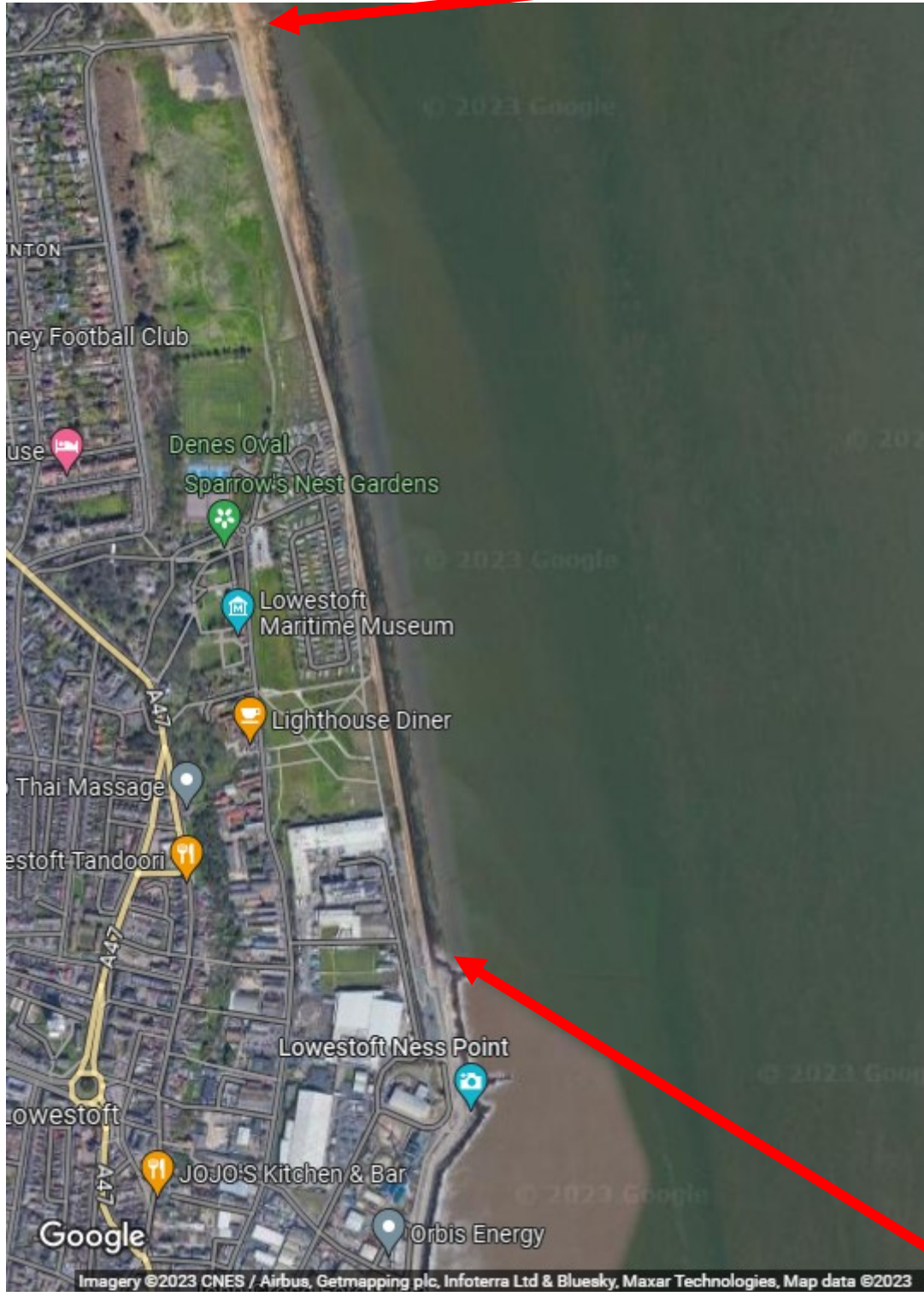
