

Aldeburgh Repairs and Maintenance

Aldeburgh, Suffolk

What are we updating you about?

East Suffolk Council's (ESC) Coastal Management service have appointed the Water Management Alliance (WMA) to complete repairs and maintenance of coastal protection assets along the Suffolk coast, which are owned or managed by ESC. WMA will be completing works at Aldeburgh as part of that contract.

Where is this work happening?

A map of where the work is taking place is on page 2 of this factsheet. The work will take place along the landward side of the seawall from Fort Green car park to the South Lookout, Aldeburgh. This will include replacement of the beach access steps near the junction of Cragg Path and Hertford Place.

There will be a temporary site compound in Fort Green car park, Aldeburgh and equipment will operate and be stored on the beach near the works location. There will be limited access to Cragg Path south of the beach access steps. An excavator will access the beach at the northern end of Cragg Path and track along the beach to the works location.

When are we doing the work?

Works is due to take place from Monday 17th March 2025 to Friday 28th March 2025.

What will we be doing?

WMA will be patching concrete on the landward side of the seawall. WMA will also be removing and replacing the timber beach access steps at the junction of Cragg Path and Hertford Place. The existing beach access steps will remain open until the new steps are in place. We will work hard to keep any inconvenience to a minimum and ask the public to please take note of the contractor's signage when work is happening.

Why are we doing this work?

This work will improve public safety and is an important part of ESC's commitment to ensure that the coastal assets they are responsible for are working effectively and are safe for the public, helping to protect our beautiful and important coastline economically and environmentally and for the enjoyment of communities and visitors for generations to come.

Undertaking regular targeted maintenance means that we can maximise the lifespan of coastal protection assets, ensuring that we make the most of every pound spent and achieve a better return on public investment. We are supporting the safeguarding of life and local economies by making sure that the Council's coastal assets are in the condition needed for continued protection.

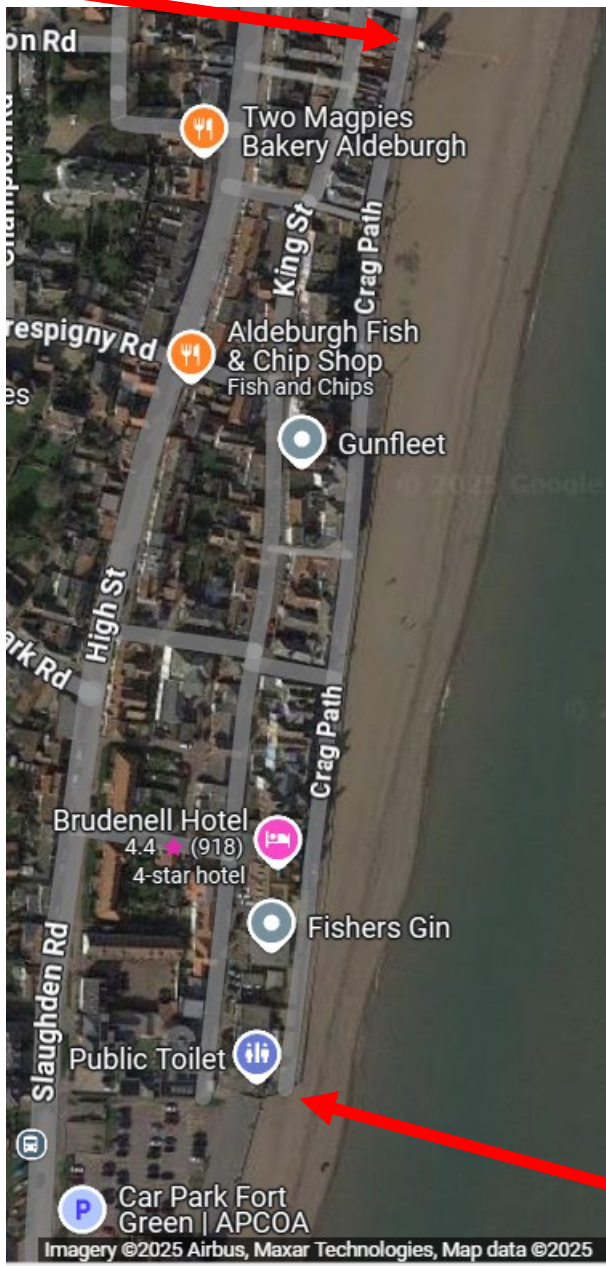
