

# Corton Village Coastal Repair Works

## Corton, Suffolk

### What are we updating you about?

Under the repair & maintenance contract we are undertaking small scale coastal protection asset repairs and maintenance works. There will be short term beach user access restrictions.

### Where is this work happening?

Repair and maintenance work is spread across the sea wall from Bakers Score at the northern end, past Tibbenham's Score and south to Tramps Alley.

Access to the coastal footpath and beach areas will not be possible across this area, clear signposting will be in place to warn beach users.

### When are we doing the work?

Repair and maintenance work will likely start from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2019 onwards, allowing our maintenance contractor to maximise work around daily tides. This work will last approximately 1 week.

All work is subject to safe working conditions, i.e. tide and weather condition dependent.

### What will we be doing?

Repair and maintenance work will be undertaken across many types of coastal protection asset in this location, including the footpath. Heavy plants will access from Tramps Alley, beach users need to beware and adhere to all safety recommendations. We will alternate work north and south of Tibbenham's Score to maximise tidal working

window and minimise beach access disruption.

### Why are we doing this work?

This work is part of East Suffolk Council's coastal protection maintenance budget utilised each year to safeguard the operational effectiveness of key assets that protect economically and environmentally important areas within local communities.

Undertaking periodic targeted maintenance ensures the coastal protection asset life span is maximised delivering better return for local investment. We are supporting the safeguarding of life and local economies in ensuring these engineered assets are in the condition they need to be when needed, i.e. they are able to withstand large tidal surges such as that on 5<sup>th</sup> December 2013.
